

A CONTRIBUTION TO THE KNOWLEDGE OF COREID FAUNA IN NATIONAL INSECT MUSEUM OF PAKISTAN (HEMIPTERA, COREIDAE)*

Abstract. The 34 identified species of the coreid fauna in the National Insect Museum of Pakistan, belonging to the former British India, are listed below. This list is being published in order to provide information to all the workers about the existence of these rare specimens in Pakistan.

The coreid fauna of Indo-Pakistan subcontinent is little known and even less is known about the coreid species present in Pakistan as representatives of Indo-Pakistan fauna. The unique zoogeographical position of Pakistan embracing both Oriental, Palearctic and Ethiopian elements makes the job of taxonomists interesting and challenging and consequently it is essential for them to know of the presence of actual specimens which are present in this part of the subcontinent for examination, comparison and evaluation.

The only earlier published information about our coreid fauna is that of Distant¹⁻³ but the descriptions are too short for taxonomic purposes. It is hoped that similar information on other groups will also be published by specialists in their respective fields.

This material in the National Insect Museum would serve the purpose of a reference collection and knowledge of it should greatly help the taxonomists and economic entomologists.
